



BMC 60th (Diamond) Anniversary 274 beer-top boutique lagerphone

Created by Brian Freeman over a 7 day period.

Dedicated to all past & present persons who have been/are instrumental in the Bush Music Club's existence and its ongoing survival.

The lagerphone's design is several diamond-based lacquered shapes; blue beer-top '60' numerals with gold and red beer top diamond in-fill areas. Logo and pictures are from February 2014 Mulga Wire and are encased in lacquer.

The head has 65 pairs of beer tops (130) while the leg has another 144 beer tops of various Australian brands grouped in four repeating groups of six.



TREASURER'S REPORT 2013

Profit and Loss

The Bush Music Club operated with a surplus of \$5518.63 which included Interest from Investments of \$4686.52.

A number of factors that contributed to the surplus included rental of Hut 44 to private organizations such as the Autism Association and a Meditation group together with and several groups using the Hut for music practice.

In addition, membership fees collected rose by over \$400 from 2012 and the Club did not run the loss- making Balmain dance in 2013.

The Heritage Ball at Parramatta, the Maitland Ball and the Beecroft Dance all proved profitable once again although a new dance at Ermington has yet to come into this category.

Expenses were similar to 2012 with the exception of a donation of \$1000 to a play which is being funded and supported by the National Library concerning the creation of a bush band in the South Coast of NSW in the 1950s.

Balance Sheet

Club assets total \$121,149.97 including investments in ANZ and Westpac Term Deposits of \$115,019.74 and a small stock of books for sale. The Club had no liabilities as at 31 December 2013.
